~Every year the Diocese of Baton Rouge invites deserving missionaries to the Missionary Cooperative Plan. This year, I, Fr. Steve Rodrigues (a Franciscan Capuchin from south India) will make an appeal in your wonderful Parish so that the Capuchin Franciscan mission continues in India by your blessings & generosity. I am grateful to Bishop Duca & your Pastor Fr. Doyle, for giving me the necessary permission to make this happen. ~The Capuchin Franciscan Order was founded by St. Francis of Assisi & is dedicated to preaching & missionary work. We are known worldwide for our zeal to reach out to the unreached & to spread faith. A Franciscan Capuchin is a man of the church & St. Francis insisted that his brothers be "thoroughly Catholic" so that they contribute to the sanctification of the Church. 'Our Christian Identity is one of being missionary.'

Following the example of St. Francis of Assisi, Capuchins give priority to two ministries: working with the poor & preaching the Word of God. Under these two descriptions fall a variety of ministries that further the dream of St. Francis: serving in prisons, homeless shelters, dispensaries, elderly, youth ministry, taking care of orphans, retreat centers, looking after poor parishes, free medical care for the poor, etc. We humbly request you to generously support us in these ministries.

- ~The Collection you will make at all the weekend Masses (on July 13th & 14th), will go to take care of the following projects: 1. To construct 5 classrooms for the education of the slow learners of a poor remote village (children & adults).
- 2. Feeding, sustaining, educating & other basic facilities for 60 children in a poor village.

3. Renovation of the Boarding building & school for the underprivileged, migrants, street children etc. The building is in a bad shape & needs urgent attention.

- 4. To help around 50 young children who have lost both of their parents due to Covid-19.
- 5. To give free medical aid to the poor; to give education to children, women & men in poor remote villages.

~We are financially very weak and to carry forward this mission, we depend on the providence of God, and on your generous and benevolent help. Thank you for your willingness to support and bless us in our mission. God bless you abundantly for your generosity and sacrifices. "Be a rainbow in someone's cloud". 'God loves a cheerful giver.' The poor children will pray for you. God bless you!
